Hillel Academy was founded in 1961 to provide a quality and comprehensive Jewish education for the children of the Dayton Jewish community. At Hillel Academy, we seek to instill in each student the appreciation of religious feeling and understanding, and the delight in pursuing excellence. In 2010, Hillel Academy moved to Beth Abraham Synagogue in Oakwood. Our Kindergarten through 6th grade program provides a superior dual curriculum which fosters activities to challenge and enhance all facets of our students' abilities.

Mission Statement

The purpose of Hillel Academy is to provide the opportunity for all Jewish children in grades Kindergarten-6, where possible, to receive an outstanding integrated Judaic and secular education. Hillel Academy provides a combination of dedicated staff, extraordinary focus, innovative curriculum, and instructional best practices to develop students with the academic and spiritual tools to develop into creative, independent, critical thinking, compassionate and responsible members of their communities.

General Information

School Hours:

- School hours are 8:00 a.m. to 3:20 p.m.
- Lunch/recess is from 11:30 – 12:20 daily.
- Supervision will be provided beginning at 7:30 a.m. Students may enter the building at that time. Supervision will continue until students begin their classes at 8:00 a.m.
- Visitors must dial “333” at the front door of Beth Abraham to gain entrance into the building during school hours.
- Because the entry doors are locked between 8:00 a.m. and 3:20 p.m., parents must ensure that their child has been acknowledged by us and the doors have been unlocked so they can proceed upstairs.
- All parents must report to the office before visiting classrooms.

Aftercare:

- Aftercare is available until 5:30 p.m., Monday thru Thursday.

Car Transportation:

To ensure the safety of all Hillel Academy students, please follow these guidelines:

- When dropping off your child, you may use the circle in front of the main entrance at Beth Abraham. **Please do not park in the circle.** Parents should use the parking lot area if you are entering the building.
- When picking up your child, please use the parking lot and enter the building through the main door.

Lunch & Food Policy:

- Students will pack and bring their individual lunches.
- Sharing of lunches will not be allowed, due to the range of different Kosher standards. .
- For your convenience common Kosher symbols are located at the end of this handbook.
- Any food at school-wide programs, PTO, or special events (example: birthday parties) are to be Kosher Pareve and checked-in with Rabbi Simon.

Physical Education:

- A student is required to bring a note from a physician if he/she is to be excused from more than one gym class for the grading period.
- Students are required to remove rings, bracelets, earrings and other loose fitting articles for gym class.
- Students are required to wear appropriate footwear.

Medication:

- If your child is on a daily medication, please have your doctor complete the “Parent Request and Release for the Administration of Oral Medication at School” form.
- In order to dispense medication to your child after an illness, we must have written permission from your child’s doctor.
- In order to dispense occasional medication, (headaches, cramps, etc.), we must have a note from your child’s doctor.

Tobacco, Alcoholic Beverages, Drugs, Weapons, Violence:

The school will enforce the law regarding any illegal use of intoxicants or weapons.

Attendance Policies

Reporting an Absence:

- To report an absence, please call the school by 7:45 a.m. each day your child will be absent. For your convenience our voice mail is on 24 hours a day.
- Homework for the day of the absence may be sent home with a sibling or picked up by 3:15 p.m.
- The school permits 10 absences per year to ensure the integrity of our program.
- After 10 absences, parents will be notified to schedule a conference regarding absenteeism.

Tardiness:

- Students are to be in the building by 7:55 a.m. with their materials for class.
- Habitual tardiness hurts the integrity of our program; therefore, after 2 tardies in a quarter the teacher will contact the parents to make them aware of the tardiness.
- If the student reaches 4 tardies in a quarter, the teacher and/or administrator will request a conference with the parents.
- If the situation is still not resolved, the administration will request a meeting with the parents and teacher to discuss possible disciplinary measures.

Appointments or Early Dismissals:

- If your child has an appointment, it is necessary to bring a note to the office before 8:00 in the morning of their appointment.

Pre-arranged Absence for Trips:

- Throughout the course of the school year, there are numerous opportunities for family vacations on scheduled days off school. Additional vacations during school time take students away from their normal lessons, and disrupts learning.

Code of Conduct

We have three words that serve as guiding principles for our Hillel Academy community: **simcha**, **chesed**, and **hatzlachah**. In our daily actions we ask every individual to bring a spirit of happiness (simcha), a disposition for kindness (chesed), and a focus on success [hatzlachah.... yogati (I have tried) u' motzati (and I have found success)].

Disciplinary Procedures

We will intercede to stop disruption of the learning process if the student is interfering with the learning environment.

Suspension:

We have the right to suspend a student based on his/her behavior, or in extreme cases, expulsion is a possibility.

Conferences:

- Conferences are held three times each year - in the fall, winter and spring.
- Parents wishing to meet with teachers at other times are encouraged to do so.

Dress Code

- In order to encourage an educational environment, students must come dressed to learn.
- All boys are required to wear a Kippah during prayer and Judaic studies.
- Shorts to the knee may be worn by students Kindergarten through 4th grade.
- All dresses and skirts must be to the knee.
- All shirts must have sleeves and stomachs must be covered.
- Inappropriate shirt messages are not permitted.
- Administration will be the final judge as to which clothing is appropriate.

Inclement Weather

- In the event of a school closing, please turn to your local television or radio stations.

Computer Usage and Rules

- Our computers are an enhancement to our program and must be used with the utmost care.
- Students may only use the computers under supervision.
- No personal email may be sent from our computers.

Disaster Preparedness

In case of tornado, fire, or other disaster requiring immediate suspension of normal classroom activities, students will either be detained at school or will move to another building in our complex.

Students will be released only to parents or individuals listed on the child's Emergency Release Form.













Every effort will be made to contact parents should such an emergency occur. If the telephone system is not operative, parents are urged to contact local authorities for information.













Parent Teacher Organization (PTO)

The Hillel Academy PTO sponsors social events as well as several fundraising activities throughout the year. Proceeds are used to purchase additional instructional equipment or to provide enhancements to the school program.

All families are automatically members of the PTO and encouraged to actively participate in its many worthwhile projects.
